



How many different sorts of writing do you do?























Tips

- Adapt what you already know
- Learn what you don't know, as you go
- Social media is social: talk with your audience
- Think global: 24/7 time zones as well as language and cultural differences
- Add new content frequently be topical
- Keep existing content up-to-date
- Adapt your style guide
- Use progressive disclosure
- Test for all platforms
- Build trust, but use silos when necessary
- Beware numerical targets








